# Naturally Occurring Mineral

- Serpentine
  - Chrysotile (pictured on the right)
- Amphiboles
  - Amosite
  - Crocidolite
  - Tremolite
  - Actinolite
  - Anthophylite

The fibers you can't see are the most dangerous to your health!




# Naturally Occurring Asbestos (NOA)

NOA is present in at least 8 of Oregon's 36 counties:

- Baker County
- Grant County
- Malheur County
- Jackson County
- Josephine County
- Curry County
- Douglas County
- Umatilla County

Note: No naturally occurring asbestos is found in Lane County.



## Health Effects from Exposure

➤ Health Issues are not always immediate

➤ Delayed symptoms of 10-40 years

Three of the major health effects associated with asbestos exposure:

- Lung cancer
- Mesothelioma
- Asbestosis

## Common Asbestos Myths

- Asbestos is banned in the US.
  - Some asbestos containing products are still legal for certain applications.
     They can be found in clothing, brake/clutch car components, and some construction materials.
- Asbestos use was stopped after a certain date
  - Asbestos use has certainly decreased but has not completely stopped
- Asbestos looks like a white fibrous rock
  - Asbestos can look like a white fibrous rock but it can also take shape in many forms and colors. You cannot tell if something contains asbestos by just looking at it. It must be tested to see if it contains any fibers.

# Regulatory Background

- 1970- Clean Air Act to help minimize the release of asbestos fibers
- 1971- EPA identified as a hazardous pollutant
- 1973- Asbestos National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP)



## Regulations

- NESHAP Rule: 40 CFR, Part 61,
   Subpart M National Emission
   Standards for Asbestos (Federal)
- DEQ Division 248 Asbestos Requirements (State)
  - Most Recent Rule Revisions Adopted in 2018
- LRAPA Title 43 Asbestos Requirements (County)
  - Must be as stringent or more stringent than the state rules



## LRAPA Rules & Regulations

#### LRAPA Title 43

- **→ 43-015-7** Applicability.
  - Prior to commencing the renovation or demolition of a facility, you must obtain a survey from an accredited asbestos inspector

Although there is no law against an *owner-occupant* renovating or removing asbestos inside their own house, LRAPA strongly recommends choosing a licensed professional contractor to do the work

## Rules for Residential Structures

### Owner-Occupant

- Survey: Highly recommended (check with LRAPA first) Required if built prior to January 1, 2004
- Notification: Not required if owner does the work / required if a licensed contractor does the abatement.
- Abatement: By licensed asbestos abatement contractor unless owneroccupant is doing the work
- **Disposal:** Subject to all transportation and disposal requirements

### Rental/Demo

- Survey: Required by an accredited asbestos inspector before project begins
- **Notification:** To regulatory agency
- Abatement: By licensed asbestos abatement contractor
- Disposal: Subject to all transportation and disposal requirements


# Commercial Renovation & Demolition

- Surveys must be performed by an accredited asbestos inspector. Demolitions ALWAYS require a survey.
- Licensed asbestos abatement contractor must remove friable asbestos-containing materials
- Non-licensed personnel can remove non-friable asbestos-containing materials as long as it remains non-friable
- Storage, transportation and disposal requirements apply for all asbestos removal



- Roof Felt





# Common Asbestos Problems

- Bottom: Friable floor tiles and vinyl sheet floor covering










# LRAPA Outreach and Education
