LRAPA Requests Comments on Revisions to the General Air Permits for Gasoline Distribution Facilities (Proposed General Air Quality Permits)

Summary

The Lane Regional Air Protection Agency invites the public to submit written comments on the conditions of the several air quality permits that apply to Gasoline Dispensing Facilities (GDFs), such as gas stations.

LRAPA is proposing updates and a renewal of:

- General Permit #22 (AQGP-22)
- General Permit #23 (AQGP-23)
- Permit Attachment AQGP-22a
- Permit Attachment AQGP-23a

These permits are officially called General Air Contaminant Discharge Permits but are referred to in this notice as general permits. These permits regulate air emissions from GDFs under LRAPA's Title 37 – Air Contaminant Discharge Permits.

About the facilities

These permits apply to GDFs, such as gas stations that store gasoline and dispense it into motor vehicles. To qualify for these general permits, a facility must:

- Meet the definition of a gasoline dispensing facility.
- Not be an agricultural operation under Oregon law.
- Not require a source-specific air permit.

Some facilities may operate multiple types of equipment that require different permits. For example, a facility that crushes rock may already have a general permit for rock crushing but may also have gasoline storage tanks and fuel dispensers. In that case, the gasoline equipment can be regulated through a permit attachment added to the facility's existing permit.

LRAPA currently regulates **111 facilities** under these general permits and attachments. A table listing affected facilities and their addresses appears later in this notice.

Why is LRAPA Proposing to Amend these Permits?

The current version of General Permit #22 was issued on April 11, 2016, with an expiration date of April 11, 2026. LRAPA is updating the permits to:

- Renew the permit and create a new General Permit #23.
- Incorporate updated GDF rules adopted by the Oregon Environmental Quality Commission on March 25, 2024.
- Clarify permit requirements.
- Update formatting.

Facilities assigned to these permits are currently expected to comply with the expired permit until LRAPA reissues and issues these proposed permits. The proposed permits would be valid for approximately 10 years after issuance.

What was changed?

The most significant changes include:

- Requiring the largest gasoline dispensing facilities to install Stage I Enhanced Vapor Recovery systems, which better control gasoline vapors during fuel deliveries.
- Requiring some facilities to install Stage I vapor balance systems when new gasoline storage tanks are installed.
- Requiring additional testing to ensure vapor control systems remain airtight.
- Requiring facilities to submit applications and reports electronically using Your DEQ Online.

Additional updates include:

- Clarifying allowed operations under the permits.
- Simplifying visible emissions and fugitive emissions requirements.
- Updating recordkeeping and reporting requirements.
- Reorganizing permit conditions for better consistency with other DEQ permits.
- Establishing a facility-wide throughput limit for gasoline dispensing.

GDF Types

Oregon's rules classify GDFs into five types based on storage tank size and the amount of gasoline dispensed each year. Different requirements apply to each type. The five types are:

- Type 1: facilities with only gasoline storage tanks smaller than 250 gallons.
- Type 2: facilities with any gasoline storage tank 250 gallons or larger.
- Type 3: facilities dispensing 120,000 or more gallons of gasoline per year.
- Type 4: facilities dispensing 600,000 or more gallons of gasoline per year.
- Type 5: facilities dispensing 1,000,000 or more gallons of gasoline per year.

A facility may fall into multiple categories. For example, a facility that dispenses more than one million gallons per year is considered Types 3, 4, *and* 5.

Under the proposed permits, AQGP-22 applies to Types 1 and 2. AQGP-23 applies to Types 3, 4, and 5.

Compliance Schedule

The Environmental Quality Commission adopted revised gasoline dispensing facility rules in March 2024. LRAPA is delegated to implement the DEQ rules in Lane County and will be implementing them by reference. Some of the deadlines in those rules occur before LRAPA will issue the updated permits. To ensure facilities have adequate time to comply, the proposed permits include a compliance schedule that extends certain deadlines.

The proposed schedule includes:

- **Initial Testing**

Facilities required to conduct vapor system testing will have 16 months from November 1, 2026, to complete testing or by March 1, 2028.

What air pollutants would the permit regulate?

This permit regulates Volatile Organic Compound and Hazardous Air Pollutant emissions. Emissions of all other pollutants are expected to remain below regulatory thresholds and are not specifically addressed by the permits.

What are the emission limits?

The permits limit how much gasoline a facility can dispense each year. This limit helps ensure emissions remain below regulatory thresholds and that facilities are appropriately regulated by the general permits.

AQGP-22 (Types 1 and 2). Maximum annual throughput: 119,999 gallons. Above this level of throughput, the facility would require coverage under the General Permit #23 or require a source-specific air permit.

AQGP-23 (Types 3, 4, and 5). Maximum annual throughput: 20,000,000 gallons. Above this level of throughput, the facility would require a source-specific air permit.

Facilities complying with these operational throughput limits will have emissions below the Significant Emission Rate and remain as area sources of Hazardous Air Pollutants.

How does LRAPA determine permit requirements?

LRAPA evaluates the qualification criteria of the permit (Condition 1.1) and then includes all relevant requirements for the activities and operations that are allowed. Additional requirements may be added based on a general risk screening of Toxic Air Contaminant emissions, to ensure permitted activities do not exceed applicable short-term emission limits, or to ensure that the facilities assigned to the permit are appropriately regulated by a general air permit instead of a source-specific air permit. LRAPA determines most permit requirements based on applicable local rules, state rules, and federal regulations.

What special conditions are in this permit?

The GDF rules in DEQ's division 244 establish different requirements based on the GDF Type of each facility. The General Permit #22 for GDF Types 1 and 2 includes:

- Generally applicable work practices to minimize emissions,
- Submerged filling requirements,
- A documented spill cleanup plan,
- A requirement to maintain any existing gasoline vapor control equipment,

- A recurring inspection requirement for facilities that have vapor controls,
- A recurring test requirement for facilities that have vapor controls, and
- Recordkeeping and reporting requirements.

The General Permit #23 for GDF Types 3, 4, and 5 includes all the requirements described above and then additional requirements that apply to these facilities with higher throughput. The permit includes:

- Requirements for installing new or different gasoline vapor controls based on the current controls installed and throughput of the facility,
- All new gasoline storage tanks must be dual-point (one entry point for gasoline and a separate exit point for vapor),
- Some facilities to install a Stage I Enhanced Vapor Recovery system and Enhanced Conventional nozzles, and
- Compliance testing requirements.

How does LRAPA monitor compliance with the permit requirements?

LRAPA will inspect facilities periodically to ensure they comply with the permit requirements. Inspections can be conducted more frequently if there are compliance issues or complaints received. Facilities are required to submit an annual report to LRAPA each year describing their production and other information required by the permit.

What happens after the public comment period ends?

After the public comment period ends, LRAPA will review all comments and may revise the permits before issuing final versions. Once the final permits are issued, LRAPA will reassign all existing permittees to the new versions of the permit.
